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Western Balkans Agenda – Flagship 5 (2018):

- "The development of the EU Digital Single Market contributes to developing businesses, creating growth, boosting productivity, promoting innovation, transforming public services and improving citizens' quality of life. It is essential that the Western Balkans are included in the EU's efforts to embrace technological change for them to be able to benefit from digital tools, ensuring a prosperous and sustainable future for their citizens"
- What has the EU done in this context?
 - Launch of the Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans.
 - Involving the region in EU working groups and structures related to digital policy areas,
 - Complementing the 'digital integration' pillar of the Regional Economic Area,
 - Supporting preparation of broadband projects,
 - Capacity building in the area of cybersecurity and support to improve national cybersecurity strategies.

- Operating cost e.g. subscriptions to digital services



- Post 2020 IPA
 allocation: +6,2% vs
 2014-2020 allocation
- For all Interreg IPACBC, IPA allocation >ERDF allocation








Interreg IPA next gen

3 Interreg IPA TN & 1 Interreg IPA IR programmes



+ URBACT IV (enlarged to 5 IPA countries)

NB: EURO NEXT MED & NEXT Black Sea -> also partially financed through IPA.

- IPA Adrion –> supports EUSAIR -> its post 2020 IPA allocation has been multiplied by **351%** vs 2014-2020
 - -> main purpose: higher degree of territorial integration



EUSAIR MRS, a boosting platform for digital transformation, networking, collaborations and convergences in the Balkans

- A regional dimension that reconnects the WB to the EU;
- A horizontal cooperation based on equal footing;
- A convergence of interests on the enlargement between EU member and IPA countries;
- A capacity building effect;
- An emphasis on the relevance of territorial cooperation and cohesion;
- An inclusive approach towards stakeholders with participatory processes (consultation, engagement and mobilisation).
